Flag Etiquette

The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing. It is flown upside down only as a distress signal.

The flag should never be used for any decorative or advertising purposes or on anything intended to be discarded after temporary use.

The flag should never have anything placed on it or attached to it.

No part of the flag should ever touch the ground.

The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except as a patch.

The flag should be cleaned and mended as needed. When a flag is worn beyond repair and respect, it should be destroyed by burning in a dignified manner.



The flag should never be carried flat or horizontally, but always aloft and free.

The flag should never be fastened, displayed, used or stored in such a manner as to permit it to be easily torn or soiled.



At all meetings the Flag should always be placed to the right of the presiding officer.




