Tobacco Surcharge

At their March 31 meeting, the State, Local Education and Local Government Insurance Committees approved a plan that calls for the implementation of a \$50 per-month tobacco surcharge for those members who use tobacco, which will go into effect January 1, 2010. These policy changes are intended to encourage plan members to take appropriate steps toward giving up use of tobacco products. The surcharge will not exceed \$50 per month even if both the employee and spouse are tobacco users.

Members who incur the surcharge will have access to a variety of resources to safely and effectively quit using tobacco, which will be paid for using surcharge funds. The committees will vote in April on coverage of specific medications and resources.
