Highlights of New Pharmacy Benefits

- 1. You will receive a welcome packet in the mail from CVS Caremark in early June with details about the new benefit.
- 2. Your packet will include pharmacy benefits ID cards. **Do not use the cards until July 1, 2010.** Carry this card and your CIGNA, United or BlueCross BlueShield with you.
- 3. July 1 there will be a new list of approved drugs. There will be some differences from your current list.
- 4. Most of your refills will be transferred automatically and in most cases you will not have to take any action.
- 5. If your prescription is not on the approved list, moves to a higher or lower tier or requires you to take special action, you will receive a letter from CVS Caremark providing detailed info about what you need to do.
- 6. Mail order will be available and you will be able to **get a** three month supply by going to a participating network pharmacy.

Questions and Answers

Will I have to change pharmacies in July?

Probably not. More than 1,600 pharmacies in Tennesse are in the CVS Caremark network.

What about ID cards?

You will receive a new pharmacy ID card as part of the welcome packet in June.

Will there be a new drug list?

Yes. A list of many of the drugs covered under the program will be mailed to you in June

What if I take a drug that's not on the list?

CVS Caremark will contact you about your options.

What will happen to drug benefits next year?

Your co-pays may change. You will be provided with information as it become available.
