Ed Roberts and Chuck Moore at the Kingston Water Plant are East Tennessee experts when it comes to using hydrogen peroxide as a disinfectant in water treatment. By using the hydrogen peroxide and implementing a planned flushing program with assistance from Robby Humphreys and the Distribution Division, Water Department personnel have been able to reduce Trihalomethanes and Haloacidic acids to levels well below state limits. If these results can be duplicated each quarter, it could save the city more than a million dollars in plant upgrades. Steve Roberts, TDEC District Director, has been very satisfied with the results, and has suggested that other utilities contact Kingston for more information.

Update—Tobacco Use Surcharge

The Tobacco Use Surcharge has been postponed until January 1, 2011, but members who choose to quit will still have access to a variety of free and low-cost quit supports including the Tennessee Department Quitline at 1-800-QUITNOW (1-800-784-8669) seven days a week. This free hotline provides cessation counseling and resource information to help kick the habit.

Until December 31, 2009 you can use your insurance card to get the following:

- \$5 copay with a prescription for nicotine replacement patches, gum and lozenges (\$10 copay for 90-day supply)
- \$5 copay for prescriptions to help members quit, such as Chantix® and bupropion (\$10 copay for 90day supply)



Members must get a prescription from their doctor for all quit aids, including those sold over the counter to ensure you pay only the copay amount. This benefit is limited to two courses of treatment, each for a maximum of 12 weeks during a calendar year for each type of treatment.
