## More Nightout News

Thanks to the skills of Gene Sutton and Pete Stinnett, Reserve Officers with the Kingston Police Department, Kingston's first celebration of the National Night Out was a great success. They had an estimated 1,500 to 2,000 visitors wander in and out of Kingston City Park between 5 and 9 p.m. on August 5 .

Residents met at the Kingston City Park for free hotdogs, pizza and Mayfield's ice cream (complete with the Mayfield cow) as part of this National Night Out against crime, now in its 25 th year.

Chief Jim Washam has hopes the relationships formed that night will lead to greater cooperation in reporting suspicious people in neighborhoods.
"We need the community's help to prevent and solve crimes," says Chief Washam. "The Police Department can't do it alone."

The national event was started in 1984 with about 400 communities, according to the National Association of Town Watch, a nonprofit based in Wynnewood, PA. More than 12,000 communities are expected to participate this year.
