Police Chief Jim Washam to Represents Cities



A committee has been formed in Roane County to formulate a plan to "beef up" security at our local schools. The "Consolidated Safety Committee" consists County Commissioner Randy Ellis, Sheriff's Office Chief Deputy Tim Phillips, our Kingston Police Chief Jim Washam (who will represent Roane County cities), Office of Emergency Services Director Howie Rose, School Resource Officer Daryl Cook, Roane County Schools Secondary Supervisor Russell Jenkins, and Board of Education Member Danny Wright.

According to Chief Washam during a meeting last week they determined it could cost as much as

\$1.8 million dollars. This plan would place a school resource officer in every school and upgrade existing school camera equipment.

The price tag for these improvements could raise taxes as much as 16 cents per \$100 for local home owners. How do you put a price on the safety of our children?

Chief Washam has been appointed as Chairman of the Board of the Hands of Mercy Association and to the Board of the Kingston Girls' Softball Association and Assistant Coach. Looks like a busy Spring for our Chief!


