The City of Kingston will be conducting a lottery drawing on in the near future, for spots in the municipal boat slips recently installed at 58 Landing. The first round of the drawing will be for city taxpayers only. If there are slips remaining, a second round will be conducted among the remaining applicants. Once the initial lottery is concluded, any remaining slips or future vacancies will be rented on a first come / first served basis. The municipal slips will be rented under an annual lease for an initial rate of \$150 per month. 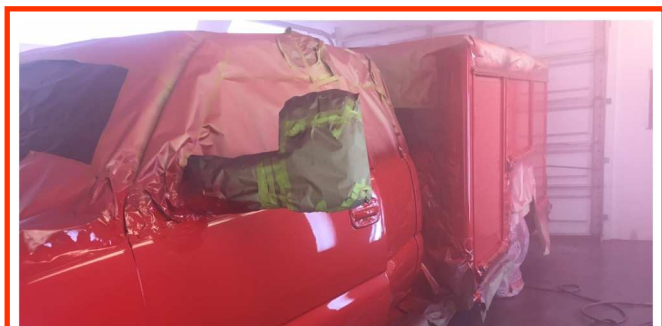
