Think you have it bad at work check out the working conditions of Water Department personnel in below freezing weather. We thank you guys for keeping our water flowing (and other non-mentionables).



### From the City Manager...

As I was sitting with my family a few nights ago, in the comfort of my living room, the temperature outside was in the single digits. I had a roaring fire just a few feet away and, like most people, I was sheltered from the harsh conditions outside. That wasn't the case for many of our city employees.



Many of us take for granted that, even during the worst weather, somebody is out there making sure that our streets and neighborhoods are safe, that our property is protected from fire, that medical care is only a phone call away, that our utilities work at the flip of a switch or the turn of a faucet, and that our roads can be safely traveled. I hate to think what it would be like if they weren't out there.

For these men and women, it's not an option to say that "its too cold" or "the roads are too bad". Their jobs have to be done, and time and again they have been called upon to put our comfort and safety above theirs and answer the call of duty. That call will inevitably come again. For some, it may mean going a day or longer without seeing their family. For others, it cold mean putting their life on the line to answer a call I the worst of conditions. Regardless of the reason, they show up time and again and I can't think of a better example of dedicated public servants.

From the bottom of my heart, I want to thank each of you who answer the call and work the long, hard hours in wind, rain, snow, and freezing cold to make sure that the rest of us are taken care of.
