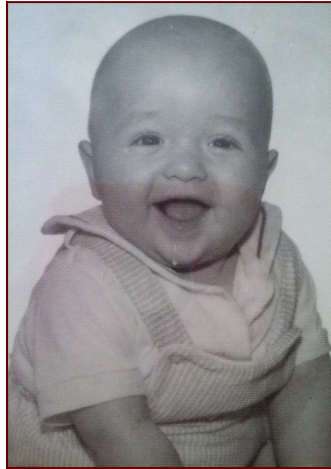


## Personal Notes, Etc.
