Finance Director Carolyn Brewer has been working with Mr. Bolling and Department Heads to make adjustments to the 2016-17 Budget to present to City Council in April. Budgets for the current fiscal year should be at 67% or below at this time.

The Loan Closing for Porter Park was held on March 11th.

Fire Department Chief Gordon reported they have increased the size of their weight room to encourage employees to develop a healthy life style.

They did flow test on hose and plan to flow hydrants all the month of April—every day except Sundays.

Water Department Distribution & Collection Manager Jimmy Agee reported they are working on clarifiers at the Wastewater Treatment Parks & Recreation Director Rick Ross has applied for building permits for 58 Landing and Land Between the Bridges.

The bid opening for Porter Park was held on March 11th and construction should begin this Spring.

It is mowing season again and Public Works employees are hard at it keeping the city trimmed. They also had a week of brush pick up this month.

Police Department – Chief Jim Washam reported one of the government Hummers was delivered to Ft. Knox today by Keith Kile.

He also discussed the need for an impound lot and reported Tim Clark said they have fencing available at Public Works.

Seven different areas in Kingston were discussed regarding code violations and where they are in the process.
