The Kingston Fire Department responded to a fire at the Budget Inn on Gallaher Road this month. The fire was in the Manager's unit and damage was estimated to be approximately \$10,000. Due to the quick response of Station 2 on Gallaher Road, it was contained to one ground level room. The new unit at Lakeview Village apartments (replacing the one that was destroyed by fire earlier this year) is scheduled to be finished this week.

Kingston Police Department Reserve Officers raised funds to help the Hands of Mercy feed about 400 families this Thanksgiving. They also held a road block with assistance from other city employees (mostly Fire Department) on October 22nd.

- Council Member Teresa Nichols had surgery on November 29th to remove her thyroid. Thankfully it was not cancerous and she should be back with us in December.


