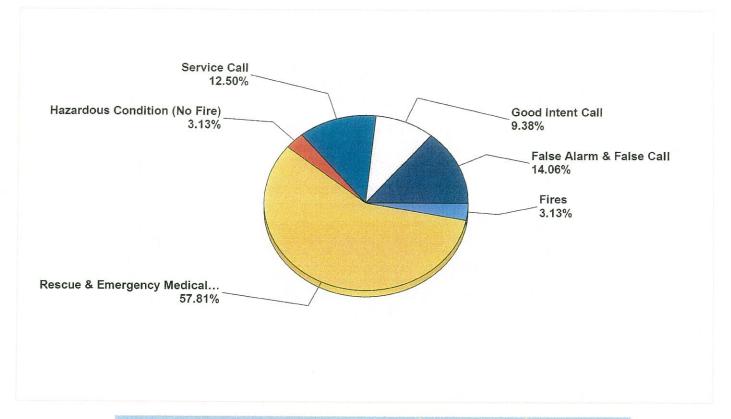

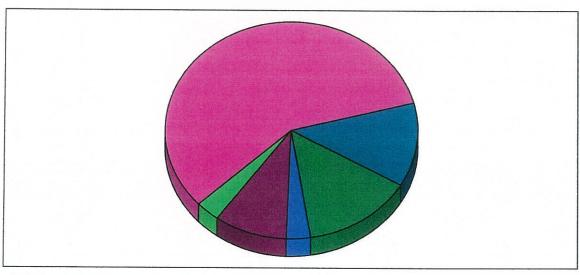

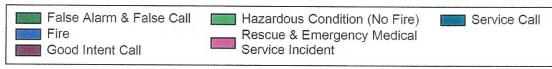

The camera system for the camera van is still having problems. The control box was sent off for repairs and the second time it was looked at, the monitor was discovered to be bad. Using a loaner control box, we were still not able to have a picture of the sewer lines. Rodders and Jets Supply are helping trouble shoot the other issues with the camera system.

PCI was able to clean the wet wells of the pump stations.

At the TAUD Business Conference in Gatlinburg, a company was demonstrating a service that may be beneficial for the City to look into. The company would be able to inspect all of the sewer lines in the city in 3-6 months. We would be given a GIS/GPS map that would show each line and the condition. The cost of repairs and or improvements would be estimated as well. This would help in creating a list of areas for repair, slip lined and or replaced. Total cost would also be spread out over a three year period.
