Everyone is Responsible for the Culture Safety Talk

There is a common saying that safety is everyone's responsibility. What about culture? What is culture and how does it affect safety and the work environment as a whole?

What is Culture?

Culture can be defined many different ways. A basic definition is "culture is the character and personality of an organization". An interesting definition is provided by the CEO of AirBnb, Brian Chesky, in a letter about culture to his employees and why it is important to a company. He defined culture as: "a shared way of doing something with passion".

Combining these two definitions together may make for an even better explanation. Culture is **how what you do** and how you do it and the effects it has on the character and personality of the organization as a whole and vice versa.

Building the Culture

In Chesky's letter he goes on to discuss that building culture is done through living the core values of an organization. He states: "We have the power, by living the (core) values, to build the culture. We also have the power, by breaking the values, to mess up the culture. Each one of us has this opportunity, this burden."

To further explain himself he discusses why culture is so important to a business. He states: "Why is culture so important to a business? Here is a simple way to frame it. The stronger the culture, the less corporate process a company needs. When the culture is strong, you can trust everyone to do the right thing. People can be independent and autonomous... Ever notice how families or tribes don't require much process? That is because there is such a strong trust and culture that it supersedes any process. In organizations (or even in a society) where culture is weak, you need an abundance of heavy, precise rules and processes."



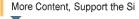
Culture and Workplace Safety

Using the words written in this letter about building culture and the benefits of it we can apply it to workplace safety. A company that truly takes action to ensure the safety of their employees in turn makes caring about employees' well-being one of their core values.

Everyone plays a part in the culture on the job and building the culture (or breaking it). When it comes to safety, the value of caring about your own well-being as well as those around you builds the culture. Actions such as following safety rules, safe work practices, and stopping work to address hazards are some basic examples of living the core value of caring about everyone's well-being on the job. When employees do not want to follow the rules, put others at risk for injury, or take shortcuts then the culture is weakened.

You as an individual worker play a part in the larger culture of the company. If a large part of the workforce on a job is taking shortcuts and ignoring basic safety rules what can be said about the culture there?

The Benefit of Building the Culture





There is a benefit to everyone at a work site when the culture is built on positive core values. Referring back to the letter, where the CEO states: "The stronger the culture, the less corporate process a company needs. When the culture is stronger on can true sweet materials the right bings from the culture being the independent of the culture and the stronger of the culture is stronger on can true sweet materials."

When the individuals of a workforce demonstrate that they are committed to living the value of caring for each other's well-being (safety) then there is much more autonomy and trust that is built. Meaning that rules and discipline are not needed to enforce safety; it becomes what is done. This allows for the entire workforce to be able to enjoy a work environment that is more relaxed, respectful, and overall enjoyable to work at compared to working in a place where there is no trust, no autonomy, and where heavy rules and processes are relied on to attempt to force employees to take certain actions.

Summary

Culture is closely connected to safety on the job. When individuals choose to work safely and care about the well-being of each other the culture can be strengthened. When a strong culture is in place through living the core values set by the company, everyone reaps the benefit of working in a safer and more enjoyable workplace.

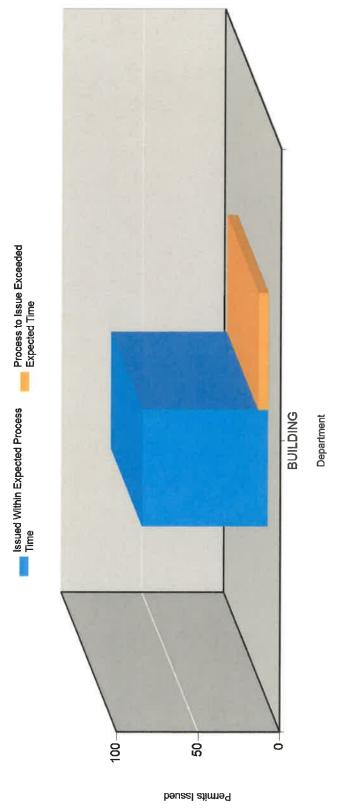

June 2021 Board Meeting

Adjourn

The regular meeting of the Rockwood Electric Utility Power Board was called to order at 4:30 p.m. on April 20, 2021. Following a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance, Chairman Holloway asked for a roll call. Board members present were Childs, Davis, Holloway, Layne, and McCullough. Social distancing guidelines were required for all attendees.

A motion was made by Layne, seconded by Davis to approve the minutes as recorded for the March 16, 2021 Board meeting. All voted yes.

As part of the financial report, Manager Bear stated the financials continue to improve. O&M expenses were slightly higher for the month of February 2021. He also stated information from the meeting with Chris Mitchell on April 12, 2021 was included in the Boardbook for review. REU can expect the fuel cost adjustment to continue increasing but this is a pass thru to customers. Manager Bear also noted that REU should go ahead and submit an Electric Vehicle Rate to TVA for approval in case we have a commercial installation for electric vehicle charging. The next meeting with Chris Mitchell is on July 13, 2021. Marsha O'Keefe informed the Board cash increased \$203,906 for the month of February 2021. Year to date cash has increased by \$2,410,214. Reports for March 2021 will reflect an increase of approximately \$500,000 due to collections for pole rental from AT&T and Comcast. McCullough asked about the long term debt payment and when it's due. O'Keefe stated in June 2021 and the funds have been set aside and are available for the payment. A motion was made by McCullough, seconded by Childs to approve the February Financial Statements. All voted yes.

The February 2021 Budget Report was provided to the Board for information. There were no questions.

Manager Bear commented on the Quarterly Overtime Report. Comparing January 2021, February 2021, and March 2021 to the same quarters in 2020, 2019, and 2018 overtime continues to decrease.

A motion was made by Davis, seconded by Layne to accept the April 2021 Accounts Payable. All vote yes.

As part of the Manager's Report, Manager Bear stated:

- The portal is now active for customers of REU interested in solar installations to use the Green Connect Program. We know of one customer that has initiated a request through the portal.
- April's Safety Meeting was held earlier in the day on Protection and Use of Personal and Vehicle Grounds. May's safety meeting is on May 18, 2021 and it is an annual recertification in Pole Top and Bucket Truck Rescue.
- The line upgrade at Camp Buck Toms has been completed and is now energized. The tear out of the old wire and poles is all that needs to be completed for the overhead portion. They are not ready for the underground services to the new dining hall.
- The City of Kingston is doing a utility audit on their Street Lighting usages. Customer Service Manager, Mike Miller, is working on getting the information for their review. They are also looking to changing out the street lights to LED lighting.

A preliminary budget will be ready for Board review prior to next month's meeting. Our strategic plan calls for the Board to have this by May 15th each year. The Board will need to approve the final budget prior to the end of June so it can be given to the City of Rockwood for inclusion in their submittals to the State of TN.

A motion was made by Layne, seconded by Davis to accept the Manager's Report. All voted yes.

There were no Visitor Comments.

A motion was made by McCullough, seconded by Childs to approve the recommendation from Manager Bear to approve the contract with Central Service Association (CSA) for their Orbit Interactive Voice Response product. The system is integrated with CSA's Outage Management System which we are already using and in turn, is integrated with our GIS and customer information systems. The new product also includes a Customer Facing Outage Map, which can be viewed by our customers. The remainder of the discounted licensing fee is \$11,600 for full deployment of the system. All voted yes.

A motion was made by Davis, seconded by Layne to approve the purchase of (30) 15 KVA CSP transformers at a cost of \$20,640 and (20) 25 KVA CSP transformers at a cost of \$17,200. Total expenditure is \$37,840.00. The lead time is 14-16 weeks. All voted yes.

A motion was made by McCullough, seconded by Childs to ratify a change in the purchase of meters approved at the March 16, 2021 Board meeting. While preparing the purchase order, we were notified by the supplier that the meters are being packaged differently, in quantities of 120 per pallet rather than 96 per pallet which is what the quote was based on. In addition, the cost per meter was reduced from \$147.25 per meter to \$136.25 per meter. We ordered two pallets at the reduced price, but in a larger quantity. The total cost of the purchase was \$32,700 as opposed to the original amount of \$28,272. All voted yes.

There are no new projects being recommended that exceed the \$10,000 threshold.

The developers of 45 lots at "The Village of Center Farms" have asked if REU would consider accepting credit references as being suitable for security toward project. Manager Bear forwarded the request to our attorney. A motion was made by McCullough, seconded by Davis to have the developers provide a letter of credit or pay for the project upfront. The board approved the project and the aid to construction cost of \$119,508.45 at its meeting in October 2020. All voted yes.

At the March meeting, it was noted by Chairman Holloway that with Allan Thompson's decision to leave the utility, a vacancy was created on the Financial Stewardship Committee and asked if Jason Jolly could fill that vacancy. Manager Bear was fairly certain that Mr. Thompson represented the Operations Department and that with Jason Jolly being in that department he could replace Allan. He was hesitant to say anything else but when he checked the "Committee Organization & Operating Guidelines" the Board approved over a year ago, He confirmed his suspicion that committee appointments go through a Nominations Committee which are then presented by the Manager to the Board for approval or ratification. He asked Larry Brackett, Chairman of the Nominations Committee, to help address this matter. Based on all this, he

would recommend Jason Jolly be appointed to serve in Allan Thompson's place on the Financial Stewardship Committee and this be properly documented in the meeting minutes. A motion was made by Childs, seconded by Davis to formally appoint Jason Jolly to replace Allan Thompson on the Financial Stewardship Committee. All voted yes.

A motion was made by Layne, seconded by Davis to approve the proposal from Fisher Arnold to complete both an Arc Flash Risk Assessment and a Coordination Study at the Buck Creek and Burke Mill Substations. The total cost is \$26,950. All voted yes.

A motion was made by McCullough, seconded by Childs to place Truck #10 for sale on the govdeals.com website. The transmission went out on the truck and to replace it would cost over \$4,000. The truck has over 160,000 miles. All voted yes.

A motion was made by McCullough, seconded by Childs to approve the write-off of uncollectible debts for the period of January 2021 in the amount of \$850.98 and noted the bad debts collected for March 2021 were \$1,367.80. All voted yes.

Chairman Holloway announced the next monthly meeting will be held on May 20, 2021 at 4:30 p.m.

A motion was made by McCullough, seconded by Childs to adjourn. All voted yes.

Chairwoman Ms. Calfee(remote) and the committee recommended that the board vote to approve a three percent revenue increase and a two percent employee pay increase adding one dispatcher for fiscal year 2021-2022. Ms. Calfee (remote) turned the remainder of the presentation of the budget over to Director Anderson. Director Anderson explained the need for an additional dispatch position to provide overlap coverage during the busy times (11am-7pm) and without the 3% increase to our revenue, if we don't receive needed state funds it would make this addition nearly impossible. Chairman Ellis asked that we wait to vote on this item until the New Business portion of the meeting.

BUILDING/EQUIPMENT COMMITTEE:

There has been no official committee meeting.

DIRECTORS REPORT:

Director Anderson referred to a letter we have received from Monolith Construction Co. Attorney. Director Anderson deferred this discussion to Atty. Mr. Greg Leffew. After having reviewed the letter from their attorney, Mr. Leffew noted that we are subject to the Prompt Pay Act and can't hold retainage money to satisfy liquidated damages. Under the Prompt Pay Act retainage can only be used to satisfy the construction contract. The letter requests a reply within 10 days, Mr. Leffew will have a response ready to send to them on Monday, April 26, 2021. Chairman Ellis

mentioned that we must first meet our contractual payment obligations, then to get the substantial list items that are needing to be completed we can file a lawsuit if necessary. Director Anderson and Mr. Brown will be getting estimates from other contractors of costs to complete some of the incomplete items on the substantial list that are still not completed. Chairman Ellis entertained a motion to have Mr. Leffew, Director Anderson, Mr. Brown meet with Upland Design Group by phone and go over the details /statutes of the contract and authorize them to respond by Letter on 4/26/2021 as requested. All members present and remote voted Aye. Motion carried. Director Anderson will arrange a phone meeting with Mr. Leffew, Mr. Brown and Mr. Allen Hill with Upland Design for 4/23/2021 at 2 pm if possible.

Director Anderson presented and email from Upland Design regarding Warranty Work on the new center. Item 1 regarding Covid related delays- Upland doesn't believe this request was submitted inside the 21 days after substantial in time to process. Mr. Jolly made a motion to agree with Upland's assessment of these delays, Ms. Calfee (remote) second the motion. All present and remote voted Aye. Motion carried. Item 2 - Contractor presented a \$7,500 credit to omit paving work at the front drive. Mr. Jolly made a motion, Ms. Calfee (remote) second to get an estimate of costs from someone else before deciding to accept this offer. After some discussion, Mr. Jolly amended his motion to have someone get a cost bid for these repairs and submit it to Upland. All present and remote voted Aye. Motion carried. Item 3- Contractor presented \$900 credit to omit future use conduit. Upland recommends we do not accept this offer. Mr. Suter made a motion, Mr. Crowe second to get a estimate and present it to Upland Design. All present and remote voted Aye. Motion carried. Item 4- Contractor has rejected the board's offer of \$4,000 on Change order #6 for \$4,757.82. Mr. Brown made a motion to pay the full amount of \$4,757.82. Tim,

In reference to a solution to install the (1) missing 1 ¼" Future Conduit, and per our onsite meeting this am, we offer the following options on the attached drawing. In offering these options, we believe these would be the lesser of disruption of the building finishes and clean up.

Option A;

We would Trench across the Rear North/West entrance at the gravel, just past the new asphalt to a point near the Northwest Site Pole. We would then directional bore under the Asphalt Driveway to a location on the West side of the building. We would then extend the conduit up the outside of the building then enter the building above finished ceiling height. The conduit would then extend above the existing ceiling and enter the electric room. There would be Junction boxes installed along the total length of the conduit run to meet NEC. We would furnish a Square Metal enclosure supplied by Baird & Wilson, to cover the exterior conduit that would match the existing Grey downspouts.

Option B;

This option is basically like option A except the conduit would enter in the rear of the North side of the building next to the 1st Downspout. This would require demo and replacement of one existing Square concrete sidewalk.

Option C:

There had been discussion of wanting power ran to the West Rear gate. In a trade for any of the options above and/or providing a future conduit, we would set a in-ground Junction box next to the West rear Site Pole and intercept the existing Branch circuitry. We would then Trench and extend (1) 1" PVC Conduit with conductors (2#8 & 1#10Grd) to an area near the West gate. We would then install (1) 120volt, 20amp Dedicated circuit all the way into Panel X inside the building. This circuit could be used for a future gate. No terminations of circuitry is included, it would be capped off at each end. Excludes, all sodding, seeding, Trench Rock excavation, General backfilling is included

We recognize the Future 1 ¼" conduit was mistakenly missed during the rough in phase of the site and we do apologize for this. Please advise what Option works best for the facility. Upon approval of any one of the options, TN 1 Call would need to access to the rear of the property to mark all the existing utilities, This would need to be coordinated.
