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PRIVATE CHAPTER NO	
BY HOUSE BILL NO.	

AN ACT to amend the Charter of the City of Kingston (Chapter 328 of the Acts of 1903 as amended by Chapter 298 of the Private Acts of 1972) under Section 7.02 of Article VII relative to the time in which to submit a proposed budget for the next fiscal year.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Article VII, Section 7.02 of Chapter 328 of the Acts of 1903 as amended by Chapter 298 of the Private Acts of 1972 is further amended by deleting the beginning paragraph in its entirety and substituting therefor the following language:

"On or before a date fixed by the council but not later than thirty (30) days prior to the beginning of the fiscal year, the manager shall submit to the council a proposed budget for the next fiscal year. The budget shall present a complete financial plan for the ensuing year, including at least the following information:"

SECTION 2. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the legislative body of the City of Kingston. Its approval or non-approval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the City Council and certified by him to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 3. For purposes of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 2.
