REGULAR MEETING KINGSTON CITY COUNCIL

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 14, 2023 – 6:00 P.M. KINGSTON CITY HALL

The Kingston City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, February 14, 2023 at 6:00 P.M. Mayor Tim Neal called the meeting to order. Council Member Tony Brown gave the Invocation and Council Member Stephanie Wright led the pledge. Upon roll call the following members were present: Council Member Philip Bredwell, Council Member Tony Brown, Council Member Randy Childs, Council Member Lucy Johnson, Council Member Stephanie Wright and Mayor Tim Neal. Staff present: City Manager David Bolling, City Clerk Kelly Jackson, Finance Director Michelle Kelley, City Attorney Andrew Thompson and Utility Director Kevin Hamilton. Vice-Mayor Tara Stockton was absent.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

ORDINANCE NO. 23-01-10-01

AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE NAME OF EAST LOVELISS STREET TO JACK MCPHERSON WAY

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated §7-86-127 provides that the authority to name public and private roads and streets, including roads and streets located within residential developments, and to assign property numbers relating to the roads and streets, is exclusively vested in the legislative bodies of counties for unincorporated areas, and municipalities within their incorporated boundaries.

WHEREAS, Chapter 16, Section 16-113 provides that names of streets in the City of Kingston shall remain as shown on said map unless officially changed by specific ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Kingston, Tennessee that:

Section 1. That the name of East Loveliss Street in Kingston, Tennessee be changed to Jack McPherson Way.

Section 2. That a request be sent to the 911 Board for approval upon passage.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect upon passage and approval by the 911 Board.
