SUMMARY: The most utilized pieces of apparatus in the Fire Department are our rescue trucks. One of our trucks, which we are proposing for replacement, is a 2003 Chevrolet 3500 with 208,170 miles.

While the Fire Department is to be commended for the way that they have taken care of this truck, it is past time to replace it. We have had this in our capital plan for some time, and I feel that we are in a position to comfortably fund it out of our undesignated fund balance without the need to burden our operating budget or to incur additional debt.

The truck being proposed is a 2024 Chevrolet 3500 Heavy Duty, which will be purchased at state contract pricing. It will then be equipped with an aftermarket shell and the appropriate emergency equipment. This will serve the department's needs while saving a considerable amount of money compared to purchasing a traditional pre-equipped box style rescue truck.

CITY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION: Appropriation of an amount not to exceed \$80,000 from the undesignated fund balance.

RE Amendment to Personnel Policy



#### **COMMENTS:**

It has been brought to the City's attention that TCA 50-6-207(1)(B)(i) regarding Workers' Compensation allows but does not require the city to allow employees to use accrued time, to be supplemented while receiving temporary disability insurance payments. Our current policy does not allow this resulting in the employee only making 66 2/3<sup>rd</sup> of their pay. It is recommended that the policy change to keep from punishing employees while they are out for a work-related injury. We are requesting that the policy be amended to remove the word 'not" in section 8.1 (9) in the last sentence of paragraph 1.

appropriate law enforcement authority, to complete an accident report that describes in sufficient detail the accident incurred. The employee will also complete a city accident investigation report that describes the incident. The supervisor or department head will conduct an investigation of the incident and complete a supervisor's property damage investigation report. These reports must be forwarded to the Safety Coordinator and City Manager within 24 hours.

# 7. Employee Negligence while operating a vehicle or equipment.

After investigation of an accident, if it can be demonstrated the employee operating the vehicle or equipment was negligent in operation of the vehicle or piece of equipment or in violation of motor vehicle regulations, operational safety rules, department guidelines or city policy, the employee may be subject to disciplinary action or termination of employment.

# 8. Driving Records

Any employee who is required as an employment condition to possess and maintain a valid Drivers or Commercial Driver's License must immediately, before reporting for duty the next workday, inform his/her supervisor should his/her license become denied, expired, suspended, restricted, or revoked any time during employment with the City. Periodic review of employee's driving records may be conducted by the city.

# 9. Workers Compensation

An employee of the City who suffers injury or illness as a result of a work-related accident or condition shall receive compensation during the period of illness or injury by the State Compensation Fund in accordance with the Tennessee Workers' Compensation Act. Workers' Compensation pays an employee 66.67% of their weekly salary once the employee has been disabled for seven (7) days. Compensation will be made as of the eighth day of disability due to an occupational injury. If the employee is disabled for seven (7) days or more, workers' compensation will pay the employee retroactively from the first full day of absence from work up to the return date. Employees receiving workers' compensation payments may not supplement their pay with accrued leave while receiving temporary disability insurance payments through worker compensation insurance.

# AN ORDINANCE REVISING THE COMPREHENSIVE CODIFICATION AND REVISION OF THE 2023 PERSONNEL RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Kingston has heretofore adopted a personnel system pursuant to Article 6, Section 6.02 of the Kingston City Charter; and,

WHEREAS, the Personnel Rules and Regulations of the City of Kingston need revision; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Kingston deems it to be in the best interest of the City to revise the Personnel Rules and Regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the section of the 2023 City of Kingston Personnel Policy dealing with Workers Compensation is hereby deleted and the following is adopted in the place.

Section 8-Safety

## 9. Workers Compensation

An employee of the City who suffers injury or illness as a result of a work-related accident or condition shall receive compensation during the period of illness or injury by the State Compensation Fund in accordance with the Tennessee Workers' Compensation Act. Workers' Compensation pays an employee 66.67% of their weekly salary once the employee has been disabled for seven (7) days. Compensation will be made as of the eighth day of disability due to an occupational injury. If the employee is disabled for seven (7) days or more, workers' compensation will pay the employee retroactively from the first full day of absence from work up to the return date. Employees receiving workers' compensation payments may supplement their pay with accrued leave while receiving temporary disability insurance payments through worker compensation insurance.

The city of Kingston Finance Department would like to request the following changes be made to the 2023-2024 budget and appropriations made to expenditures to accommodate the following needs.

A donation has been made for \$1500 to support the Veterans breakfast program as well as a reimbursement from the NFL for \$4520 to support the Flag Football Program. Parks and Rec is also amending \$7,980.67 from the Sale of Surplus items sold to assist with the cost of the much-required water line repairs to the Community Center.

Parks and Rec also needs to amend \$8000 which was awarded in TCAD grant that furnishes recreation supplies for Senior programs.

The library received money for a Tech grant which is reimbursing expenses paid for the grant guidelines in the amount of \$1156.

The police department had many manufacturing delays in trying to equip the Police Car's that were being paid for with ARPA money. That pushed those expenses into this budget year and we need to amend \$1,155.33 to finalize the project of properly equipping these vehicles.

Public Works has sold some surplus items and would like to amend those funds in the amount of \$10,522 to purchase a plasma cutter.

The following items are being funded out of fund balance to cover expenses paid: Ladd Park Project for \$13,000, STP Ladd Blvd project for 398.72, and the now completed I40 Lighting Project for \$116,709.98. Lastly, the Fire Hall had some expenses that needed to be covered out of the Fire Hall roofing and renovations from last year that didn't get completed until this current budget in the amount of \$5,509.32. All of these fund balance projects total to \$135,618.02.

The Water and Sewer Budget also requires an amendment this month in the amount of \$23,249.52 to cover expenses paid and being reimbursed by the TDEC ARPA Funding.

SECTION 2. The instructor for the program will be an employee of the City appointed by the City Manager.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, the public welfare requiring it.

#### CITY OF KINGSTON DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAM PROGRAM STATEMENT

Rules and guidelines of the program:

A. Those eligible to attend the program:

Referrals from Kingston city court;

Referrals from all state courts;

Referrals from other city courts

B. Curriculum to be taught or reference list of material to be taught:

Tennessee Drivers manual,
TCA Laws and Rules of Road
safety films, videos, slides);
TCA Motor Vehicle Section;
National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) approved materials
and Tennessee Department of Safety statistic materials

C. Adoption of instructors position for teaching or instructing the programs:

Instructor will be a salaried employee of the city of Kingston

D. Fees:

All fees collected from attendees to go through the program will be paid into the general fund of the city of Kingston.

E. Department of Safety approval:

City courts must follow same guidelines as county courts, except the City Council/Alderman must act as Governing Legislative Body.

#### F. Instructors:

- 1. Department of Safety must receive resume of education and experience in motor vehicle laws, enforcement and traffic control.
- 2. Court approved recommendation with resume of the instructor.
- 3. For four (4) hour to eight (8) hour defensive driving course the instructor must be a certified instructor for Defensive Driving Course approved by National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), for that time span safety program.
- 4. Also of knowledge of safety laws and procedures for operators and passenger to use while on public highways in a motor vehicle or on a motorcycle.
- 5. For safety program under time frame of less than four (4) hours.
- 6. A three (3) year experience (minimum) police officer or court officer may be accepted for instructing a less than four (4) hour safety program.
- 7. An instructor with minimum experience in teaching highway safety such as a driver's education teacher with the State Board of Education will be approved for the short safety programs under four (4) hours.
- 8. A certified Defensive Driving Course (DDC) instructor will qualify for any program up to eight (8) hours.

An approved instructor for the court program doing an eight (8) hour defensive driving course will not be accepted to do driver improvement course for referrals of drivers to complete a (DDC) unless they are approved by the Department of Safety Driver Improvement Division for the state.
